Did you know...

Our School Division is committed to keeping its staff and students safe at all time? District and school staff train for and participate in various emergency situations through the HOUR ZERO SCHOOL EMERGENY PROGRAM. During the month of September Crestomere School is focusing on <u>Fire Drills, Emergency Evacuations</u> and <u>Lock-Down</u> procedures...all because there is nothing more important than the safety of our CR family.



A <u>Lock-Down</u> is a process for securing staff and students in designated areas/zones (classrooms/office/gym) during incidents when there is a **THREAT OF VIOLENCE**, where the treat is inside the building and when it may be more dangerous to evacuate than to say inside.

Emergency Evacuation is used to clear all students and staff from a building, in a prescribed and rehearsed manner, via prearranged evacuation routes. Our school has maps posted throughout the building indicating designated routes. In the event of an emergency situation that prevents us from returning to the building, our Evacuation Centre is the Country Shop located just east of our school.



During the month of October, we are focusing on preventing the spread of flu viruses and practicing Hold and Secure safety procedures.

Hold and Secure is a process used to lock all exit/entrance (exterior) doors of the school when there is an emergency

situation in close proximity to the school, outside the school on school grounds and/or unrelated to the school. Be sure to ask your child(ren) how our drills are going.

Dear Parents.

RE: Fair Notice

The safety of our children is a top priority for us all. We, as a school system, have been involved in intensive safety training and collaboration with our community partners – the police, Alberta Health Services (Mental Health) and Child and Family Services. Together we have created and signed a community protocol for responding to all situations in which students may be posing a threat to themselves or others.

This letter is to inform you that we, as a school system, adopted policy in January 2003 that mandates schools to have a "zero tolerance" stance for not investigating all threats and threatening behaviours (Admin Procedure 167). The purpose of the investigation/assessment is to determine how best to support high-risk students so that their behaviour does not become hurtful or destructive. Please be assured that if your principal is aware of threatening behaviour, he/she will be taking measures to deal with the situation in a positive and proactive manner. If your principal invites you to a meeting to discuss safety concerns about your own child, please be assured that protocol is being followed and that the goal is safety, not punishment.

This letter is intended to serve our community with **fair notice** that we, as a school community, will not accept "no response" to a threat making behaviour. Our goal is to respond to all threats in a professional manner that provides for a healthy and caring learning environment.

We are proud to be able to provide this level of support to our school communities and are most fortunate to have our community partners at our side.



To Whom it May Concern,

Crestomere School is a rural country school that serves over 140 students from Kindergarten to Grade 9. We have a dedicated team of educators that do their best to ensure that all the students achieve the goals that we and they have set for themselves. In order for students to succeed in school proper nutrition is vital. During the 2016-17 year we piloted a Breakfast Program and served all the students with a healthy breakfast every Tuesday morning! Needless to say it was a huge success. The students enjoyed the food and stated that they felt better and had more energy throughout the day to complete their work.

This year we will be continuing our Breakfast Program every Tuesday, and would like to add an additional day. The cost to run this program is substantial and we are seeking assistance from our local community to help us continue to grow our program. The cost to operate for the year serving two breakfasts a week would be approximately \$5,000 (65 breakfasts) Outlined below are the levels of sponsorship to our program:
